The Department does not redact any information from these submissions. This means that personal information including names, phone numbers, addresses and similar information that a member of the public elects to submit to the Department and its commissions may appear on the Department's website or in other public documents that members of the public may inspect or copy.

**A. CONSENT CALENDAR**

All items listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar and are considered routine by the Zoning Administrator. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the public so requests, in which case the matter shall be removed from the Consent Calendar and considered as a separate item at this time or at a future hearing.

**1. 2020-011803VAR (MARY WOODS)**

**2915 BAKER STREET**, Lot 006 in Assessor's Block 0940 in a RH-2 Zoning District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to construct a 4-story horizontal addition for a new elevator along the north property line within the required rear yard per a "Reasonable Modification" pursuant to Planning Code Section 305.1.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a rear yard of approximately 15 feet. The proposed elevator addition will fall entirely within the required rear yard. Therefore, the project requires a variance.

**3515 PACIFIC AVENUE**, Lot 019 in Assessor's Block 0970, located within an RH-1 (Residential, House - One-Family) Zoning District and a 40-X Height District.

**FRONT YARD LANDSCAPING & PERMEABILITY AND REAR YARD VARIANCES SOUGHT:** The proposal is to demolish a single-family dwelling and construct a replacement single-family dwelling.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 132 requires that at least 20 percent of all required front setback areas shall be landscaped, and that 50 percent of all required front setback areas shall be permeable surfaces. The permeable surface area may be inclusive of the area counted towards the landscaping requirement. The proposed single-family dwelling does not include any landscaping or permeable surfaces in the required front setback area. Therefore, a variance is required.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a rear yard equal to 30% of the lot depth. The subject property has a required rear yard of approximately 28 feet. The proposed single-family dwelling extends into the required rear yard. Therefore, a variance is required.

**173 KENSINGTON AVENUE**, Lot 050 in Assessor's Block 2975 in RH-1(D) Zoning District and 40-X Bulk District

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to establish two compact off-street parking spaces in the rear yard with a fence and gate as screening.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a rear yard equal to 30% of the total depth, or approximately 25 feet for this lot. Planning Code Section 136(c)(30) clarifies that parking is not permitted in required yards. The two off street parking spaces will be located within the required rear yard. Therefore, a variance is required.

### 4. 2020-010534VAR (MATHEW CHANDLER)

**237-239 CHATTANOOGA STREET**, Lot 024 in Assessor's Block 3649 in a RH-2 Zoning District and 40-X Height & Bulk District.

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The project proposes a horizontal addition at the basement level, replacement and enlargement of existing, noncomplying multi-story decks with stair at the rear, and the addition of one Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) at the basement level per California Government Code Section 65852.2.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a rear yard of approximately 52 feet 8 inches. The building exists as a noncomplying structure with multi-level decks and stairs extending approximately 15 feet 3 inches into the required rear yard. The reconstructed decks and stair will extend approximately 15 feet 6 inches into the required rear yard. Therefore, a variance is required.

**345 FULTON STREET**, Lot 007A in Assessor's Block 0792 in an NCT-3 Zoning District and 65-X Height and Bulk District.

**EXPOSURE VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The project proposes the addition of four ADUs to an existing 28-unit building. One of the ADUs is proposed at the front of the existing building with glazing facing onto the street, one is proposed at the rear of the building with glazing facing onto the rear yard, and two of the proposed ADUs are proposed with glazing facing an interior court yard.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 140 requires all dwelling units to face directly onto a qualifying open area. The Zoning Administrator is allowed to grant a waiver for reduced exposure for an ADU if qualifying windows face an open area that is 1) no less than 225 square feet in size, 2) has no horizontal dimension less than 9 feet, and 3) is open to the sky with exception of permitted obstructions outlined in Section 140. Unit #2 and Unit #3 are proposed to face a courtyard that does not meet these requirements. Therefore, a variance is required.

**8 NEBRASKA STREET**, Lot 002 in Assessor's Block 5655 in RH-1 Zoning District and 40-X Bulk District.

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to construct a rear deck on an existing two-story residential building.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 242(e)(2)(A) requires the subject property to maintain a required rear yard of 45.5 feet from the front property line. The existing building is currently located in the required rear yard, and the proposed deck would be fully within the required rear yard. Therefore, a variance is required.

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to construct a one-story, 650 square-foot, detached garage within the required rear yard.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a rear yard equal to 30% of the lot depth, which is approximately 20 feet from the rear property line. The proposed detached garage will be located within the rear yard. Therefore, a variance is required.

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to replace existing, noncomplying rear stairs and landings and to partially remove and replace the foundation, a brick wall, and a window at the rear.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a rear yard equal to 45% of the lot depth or the average of the two adjacent properties. The subject property is required to provide a 45-foot 3-inch rear yard. Portions of the proposed stair and landing fall within the required rear yard. Therefore, the project requires a variance.

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to build a spiral stairway to an existing 2nd floor deck at the rear.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the property to maintain a rear yard that is 25% of the lot depth but in no case less than 15 feet, whichever is greater. The proposed spiral stair falls entirely within the required rear yard. Therefore, the project requires a variance.

**330 ROOSEVELT WAY**, Lot 044 in Assessor's Block 2607 in a RH-2 Zoning District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

**REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT:** The proposal is to raise the roof height of an existing kitchen at the rear of a 3-story single-family residence.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires the subject property to maintain a required rear yard of 15 feet from the rear property line. The existing building, including the portion proposed to increase in height, is located in the required rear yard. Therefore, the project requires a variance.

**C. PUBLIC COMMENT:**

At this time, members of the public may address the Zoning Administrator on items of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Zoning Administrator except agenda items. With respect to agenda items, your opportunity to address the Zoning Administrator will be afforded when the item is reached in the meeting. Each member of the public may address the Zoning Administrator for up to three minutes.

The Zoning Administrator will not take action on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, including those items raised at public comment. In response to public comment, the Zoning Administrator may:

- (1) respond to statements made or questions posed by members of the public; or
- (2) request staff to report back on a matter at a subsequent meeting; or
- (3) direct staff to place the item on a future agenda. (Government Code Section 54954.2(a))

## ADJOURNMENT

**Notice**

The Planning Department has moved to a new office. Since August 17, 2020, the Planning Department is now located at **49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400**.

**Hearing Procedures**

The **Zoning Administrator** typically holds Variance Hearings on the **4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month at 9:30 a.m.**, at the **San Francisco City Hall, Room 408**. However, due to Covid-19 and in compliance with the Shelter-In-Place Order in San Francisco, the Zoning Administrator has been holding his monthly Variance Hearings remotely using Video and Teleconferencing since April 2020.

At the hearing, the **Project Sponsor** (Variance Applicant) will be given 5 minutes to present their case, including relevant testimony and evidence. The hearing room is equipped with a projector that can display photographs, architectural plans or other drawings and images. **Members of the public** will be given 3 minutes each to speak on the item. If a member of the public speaks against an item, the Project Sponsor will be given a 3-minute **rebuttal**.

Persons attending a hearing may comment on any scheduled item. When speaking, please note that a **timer** is used for each speaker and indicates how much time remains. Speakers will hear a notification indicating that the speaker's opportunity to address the Zoning Administrator is about to end or has ended.

Please note that some items may appear on the **Consent Calendar**. These items are considered routine and may be granted by the Zoning Administrator. There is no separate discussion of consent items unless the Zoning Administrator, member of the public or staff so requests, in which event the matter is removed from the Consent Calendar and will be moved to the Regular Calendar in the Agenda.

In addition, the Zoning Administrator may consider a request for **continuance** to a later date. He may choose to continue the item to the date proposed, to continue the item to another date, or to hear the item on this calendar.

After all the testimonies are submitted, the Zoning Administrator will consider the evidence, deliberate, and either make a decision, take the matter under advisement, or continue the matter in order for additional information to be presented.

Each hearing ends with **general public comment**, at which time members of the public may address the Zoning Administrator for up to 3 minutes on items of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Zoning Administrator, except agenda items. With respect to Agenda items, your opportunity to address the Zoning Administrator will be afforded when the item is reached during the meeting.

All Agenda of Variance Hearings and its Audio Recording (from June 2010 to present) are available on our website for access.

### **Sound-Producing Devices Prohibited**

The ringing of and use of mobile phones and other sound-producing electronic devices are prohibited at this meeting. Please be advised that the Zoning Administrator may order the removal of any person(s) responsible for the ringing or use of a mobile phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices (*67A.1 Sunshine Ordinance: Prohibiting the use of cell phones, pagers and similar sound-producing electronic devices at and during public meetings*).

### **Decision Letter and Appeal Process**

No decision is final until a **Variance Decision Letter** is issued. Due to current backlogs, decision letters may take **up to 2 months** to complete from the date of the hearing. The Zoning Administrator's action to grant or deny a variance application may be appealed to the Board of Appeals within **10 days** of the date of the Decision Letter. If any members of the public would like to receive a copy of the signed Variance Decision Letter via email, please send a request by email addressed to the Planner assigned to the case. The name of the Planner can be found in this Agenda, in the notice that you received in the mail, or in the poster posted on the subject property.

**Protest of Fee or Exaction**

You may protest any fee or exaction subject to Government Code Section 66000 imposed as a condition of approval in accordance with Government Code Section 66020. The protest must satisfy the requirements of Government Code Section 66020(a) and must be filed within 90 days of the date of the first approval or conditional approval of the development referencing the challenged fee or exaction. For purposes of Government Code Section 66020, the date of imposition of the fee shall be the date of the earliest discretionary approval by the City of the subject development.

The Zoning Administrator's approval or conditional approval of the development subject to the challenged fee or exaction as expressed in its Motion, Resolution, or Discretionary Review Action or the Zoning Administrator's Variance Decision Letter will serve as Notice that the 90-day protest period under Government Code Section 66020 has begun.

**Challenges**

Pursuant to Government Code Section 65009, if you challenge, in court, (1) the adoption or amendment of a general plan, (2) the adoption or amendment of a zoning ordinance, (3) the adoption or amendment of any regulation attached to a specific plan, (4) the adoption, amendment or modification of a development agreement, or (5) the approval of a variance, conditional-use authorization, or any permit, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the Zoning Administrator or Planning Commission, at, or prior to, the public hearing.

**CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code**

If the Zoning Administrator's or Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. This appeal is separate from and in addition to an appeal of an action on a project. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

**Privacy Policy**

SF Planning is committed to protecting the privacy rights of individuals and security measures are in place to protect personally identifiable information (PII), i.e. social security numbers, driver's license numbers, bank accounts. Members of the public are not required to provide PII to the Commission or Department, as all written submittals and oral communications become part of the public record, which can be made available to the public for review and/or viewable on Department websites. Members of the public submitting materials containing PII are responsible for redacting said sensitive information prior to submittal of documents to Planning.
