Accessible Meeting Policy

Hearings are held at **City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 408, Fourth Floor**, San Francisco, ÇA 94103. <u>629 POST STREET,</u> Lot 032 in Assessor's Block 0305, in an RC-4 Zoning District, Group Housing and Priority Equity Geographies SUDs, and 80-T-130-T Height and Bulk District

DWELLING UNIT EXPOSURE, USABLE OPEN SPACE, AND BICYCLE PARKING VARIANCES SOUGHT: The proposal is to convert 19 Single Room Occupancy (SRO) group housing rooms to SRO dwelling units within the existing building.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 135 requires each new dwelling unit to have usable open space of at least 36 square feet if private, and 48 square feet per Dwelling Unit if common. The subject property has no usable open space. Therefore, a variance is required.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 140 requires each dwelling unit to have a qualifying window facing directly onto a street, compliant rear yard, or an open area that meets minimum dimensional requirements. 10 of the proposed dwelling units face only Isadora Duncan Lane, a substandard open area. Therefore, a variance is required.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 155.2 requires the project to provide 19 Class 1 bicycle parking spaces and 1 Class 2 bicycle parking space. The proposal includes no bicycle parking. Therefore, a variance is required.

(MICHELLE LANGLIE)

<u>42-50 ALLEN STREET</u>, Lot 012 in Assessor's Block 0096, in an RH-3 Zoning District, Family and Senior Housing Opportunity SUD, and 40-X Height and Bulk District

EXPOSURE VARIANCE SOUGHT: The proposal is to convert the two existing ground floor garages into two Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) in conjunction with voluntary seismic upgrades to the existing 4-unit building.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 140 requires that each Dwelling Unit has windows that face directly onto a public street or alley at least 20 feet in width or rear yard meeting the requirements of this Code. ADUs may also receive a waiver to only front an area of 225 square feet. However, the proposed ADUs will not front a qualifying street or open area. Therefore, a variance is required.

(HEATHER SAMUELS)

839 EDINBURGH STREET, Lot 008A in Assessor's Block 6352, in an RH-1 Zoning District, Priority Equity Geographies SUD, and 40-X Height and Bulk District

REAR YARD VARIANCE SOUGHT: The proposal is to legalize a two-story rear expansion into the required rear yard that was constructed without the benefit of a building permit.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires a rear yard equal to 30% of the lot depth. The proposed expansion obstructs 2 feet and 3 inches into the required rear yard and does not provide the required 5-feet side setbacks to be permitted per Planning Code Section 136(c)(25)(b). Therefore, a variance is required.

(CLAIRE FEENEY)

<u>1000 BROADWAY</u>, Lot 054 in Assessor's Block 0150, in an RH-2 Zoning District, and 40-X Height and Bulk District

FRONT SETBACK AND REAR YARD VARIANCES SOUGHT: The proposal is to construct 3 separate buildings containing a total of 5 dwelling units on a currently vacant corner lot. It also includes a two-level, full-lot coverage, subterranean podium for a parking garage.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 132 requires a front setback of nearly 9 feet from the property line on Broadway. The proposal includes a two-story, full-lot coverage, subterranean garage level that encroaches into the entire front setback. Therefore, a variance is required.

PLANNING CODE SECTION 134 requires a rear yard equal to 30% of the lot depth. The proposal includes a two-level full-lot coverage subterranean podium and a detached residential building (1601-1625 Taylor Street) that encroaches into the entire rear yard. Therefore, a variance is required.

C. PUBLIC COMMENT:

At this time, members of the public may address the Zoning Administrator on items of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Zoning Administrator except agenda items. With respect to agenda items, your opportunity to address the Zoning Administrator will be afforded when the item is reached in the meeting. Each member of the public may address the Zoning Administrator for up to three minutes.

The Zoning Administrator will not take action on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, including those items raised at public comment. In response to public comment, the Zoning Administrator may:

- (1) respond to statements made or questions posed by members of the public; or
- (2) request staff to report back on a matter at a subsequent meeting; or
- (3) direct staff to place the item on a future agenda. (Government Code Section 54954.2(a))

ADJOURNMENT

Hearing Procedures

The **Zoning Administrator** typically holds Variance Hearings on the **4**th **Wednesday of each month** at **9:30 a.m**., at the **San Francisco City Hall, Room 408.** City Hall is located at One Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA 94102. Hearings are open to the public.

At the hearing, the **Project Sponsor** (Variance Applicant) will be given 5 minutes to present their case, including relevant testimony and evidence. The hearing room is equipped with a laptop and projector that can display photographs, architectural plans or other drawings and images. **Members of the public** will be given 3 minutes each to speak on the item. If a member of the public speaks against an item, the Project Sponsor will be given a 3-minute **rebuttal**.

Persons attending a hearing may comment on any scheduled item. When speaking, please note that a **timer** is used for each speaker and indicates how much time remains. Speakers will hear a notification indicating that the speaker's opportunity to address the Zoning Administrator is about to end or has ended.

Please note that some items may appear on the **Consent Calendar**. These items are considered routine and may be granted by the Zoning Administrator. There is no separate discussion of consent items unless the Zoning Administrator, member of the public or staff so requests, in which event the matter is removed from the Consent Calendar and will be moved to the Regular Calendar on the Agenda.

In addition, the Zoning Administrator may consider a request for **continuance** to a later date. He may choose to continue the item to the date proposed, to continue the item to another date, or to hear the item on this calendar.

After all the testimonies are submitted, the Zoning Administrator will consider the evidence, deliberate, and either make a decision, take the matter under advisement, or continue the matter in order for additional information to be presented.

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Each hearing ends with **general public comment**, at which time members of the public may address the Zoning Administrator for up to 3 minutes on items of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Zoning Administrator, <u>except agenda items</u>. With respect to Agenda items, your opportunity to address the Zoning Administrator will be afforded when the item is reached during the meeting.

All Agenda of Variance Hearings and its Audio Recording (from June 2010 to present) are available on our website for access.

Decision Letter and Appeal Process

No decision is final until a **Variance Decision Letter** is issued. Due to current backlogs, decision letters may take **up to 2 months** to complete from the date of the hearing. The Zoning Administrator's action to grant or deny a variance application may be appealed to the Board of Appeals within **10 days** of the date of the Decision Letter. If any members of the public would like to receive a copy of the signed Variance Decision Letter via email, please send a request by email addressed to the Planner assigned to the case. The name of the Planner can be found in this Agenda, in the notice that you received in the mail, or in the poster posted on the subject property.

Protest of Fee or Exaction

You may protest any fee or exaction subject to Government Code Section 66000 imposed as a condition of approval in accordance with Government Code Section 66020. The protest must satisfy the requirements of Government Code Section 66020(a) and must be filed within 90 days of the date of the first approval or conditional approval of the development referencing the challenged fee or exaction. For purposes of Government Code Section 66020, the date of imposition of the fee shall be the date of the earliest discretionary approval by the City of the subject development.

The Zoning Administrator's approval or conditional approval of the development subject to the challenged fee or exaction as expressed in its Motion, Resolution, or Discretionary Review Action or the Zoning Administrator's Variance Decision Letter will serve as Notice that the 90-day protest period under Government Code Section 66020 has begun.

Challenges

Pursuant to Government Code Section 65009, if you challenge, in court, (1) the adoption or amendment of a general plan, (2) the adoption or amendment of a zoning ordinance, (3) the adoption or amendment of any regulation attached to a specific plan, (4) the adoption, amendment or modification of a development agreement, or (5) the approval of a variance, conditional-use authorization, or any permit, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the Zoning Administrator or Planning Commission, at, or prior to, the public hearing.

CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code

If the Zoning Administrator's or Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. This appeal is separate from and in addition to an appeal of an action on a project. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative

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declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <u>http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447</u>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Privacy Policy
