Ramaytush Ohlone Acknowledgement

a. San Francisco Waterfront Resilience Program Update

The Port of San Francisco and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers finalized the San Francisco Waterfront Flood Study and produced a Recommended Plan. The Recommended Plan supports both the development of a long-term strategy for a safer and more resilient waterfront and the delivery of near-term improvements to defend the city and its waterfront from earthquakes, flooding, and sea level rise. Port staff will provide an update on the Recommended Plan and related projects.

b. San Francisco Shoreline Adaptation Plan

The San Francisco Shoreline Adaptation Plan (“Shoreline Plan”) will guide how the City prepares the coastline for sea level rise and related challenges, such as flooding.
