- 7:16 Priyoti presentation begins
- Traffic is back to pre-pandemic levels

- 75% of traffic in northeast quadrant of SF is coming from within the City
- High income groups are most likely to drive downtown during peak hours
 - Low income groups least likely. Most needed to protect from an equity perspective
- Goal reduce peak care trips downtown by 15%
- Currently analyzing 3 scenarios, with varying levels of fees, discounts, who pays, and which direction charges fees.
- Planning to provide final recommendations in fall/winter of 2021
- Implementation is 3-5 years away if it is approved
- Robin: has issue with subsidies, as it may encourage driving or giving people subsidies who don't deserve or need it. Supports proposed boundaries
- Tony: Are state legislators supportive of it? A: Not aware of any specific support yet, but there is broad awareness of it
- Krute: Why do zone residents not get a discount in two of the scenarios? A: comes down to how heavily we are discounting low-residents regardless of zone of residence.
- Krute: What is the plan for getting SF residents who drive downtown for getting them out of their cars? A: Looking at gaps, and where people are traveling from the most. Is it because of a lack of other options, or because they just prefer driving?
- Ted: Very supportive of project, no comments

 - Project fee payment based on the status of a project

 - Some areas initially anticipated to have height increases do not, due to the Hub regulations
 - We do expect revenues to catch up

Robin also notes potential conflict of interest on the part of selection panel (selected member's son). Says nobody has been keeping track of what they are spending and what they are spending it on.

Commissions, boards, councils and other agencies of the City and County exist to conduct the people's business. This ordinance assures that deliberations are conducted before the people and that City operations are open to the people's review.

PUBLIC COMMENT

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At this time, members of the public may address the Committee on items of interest to the public that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Committee except agenda items. With respect to agenda items, your opportunity to address the Committee will be afforded when the item is reached in the meeting with one exception. When the agenda item has already been reviewed in a public hearing at which members of the public were allowed to testify and the Committee has closed the public hearing, your opportunity to address the Committee must be exercised during the Public Comment portion of the Calendar. Each member of the public may address the Committee for up to three minutes.

The Brown Act forbids a committee from taking action or discussing any item not appearing on the posted agenda, including those items raised at public comment. In response to public comment, the committee is limited to:

- 1. responding to statements made or questions posed by members of the public; or
- 2. requesting staff to report back on a matter at a subsequent meeting; or
- 3. directing staff to place the item on a future agenda. (Government Code Section 54954.2(a))
