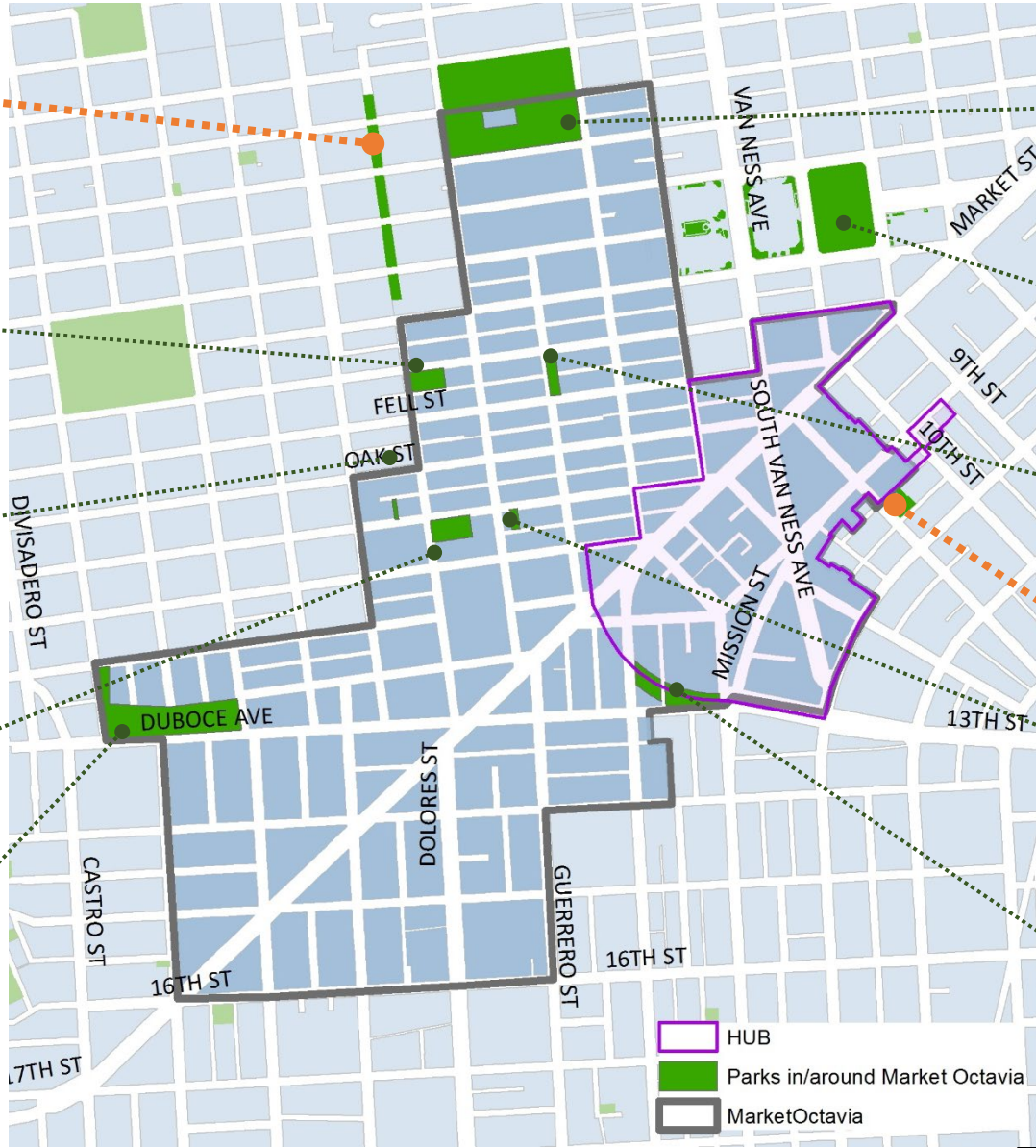

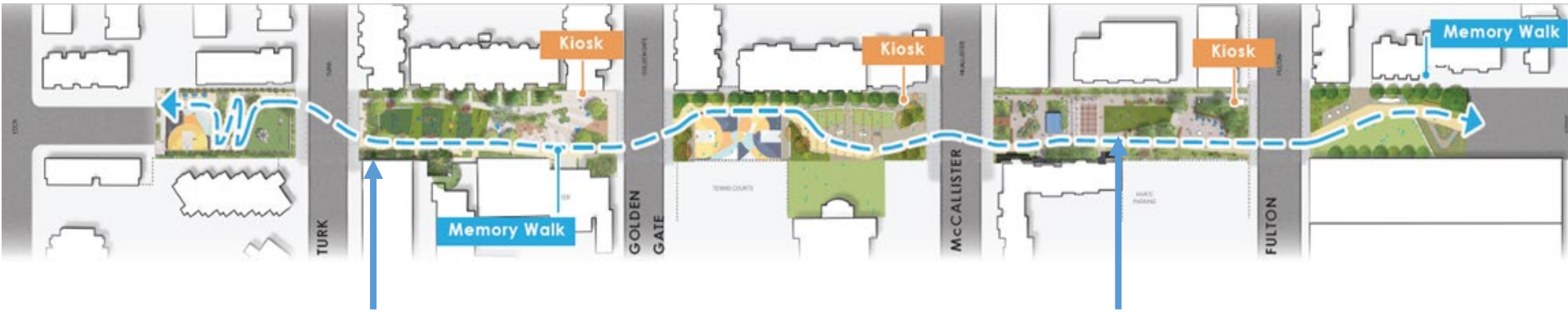

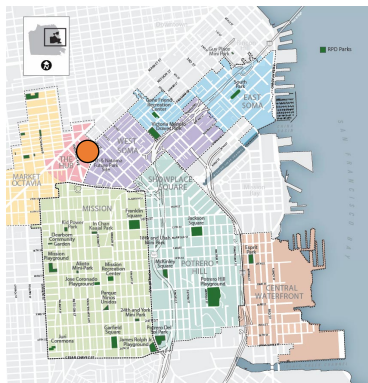

Rachele Sullivan Park (11th & Natoma Park)

SITE PLAN

ACTIVE

Spaces that support physical health and wellness activate the park entrance and provide a buffer against busy 11th Street.

- (a) Half basketball court (supports multiple uses)
- (b) Adult fitness area

GARDEN

Situated in the prime sun zone of the site, lush planting beds and winding paths frame and connect a variety of intimate spaces with individual and social seating.

- (c) Garden planting
- (d) Group seating areas
- (e) Quiet individual seating areas
- (f) Garden shade structure

PLAY

A nature exploration area links the school-age children's play area with the surrounding park plantings

- (g) School-age children's play area
- (h) All-ages nature exploration area

OTHER ELEMENTS

- (i) Dog relief area
- (j) Recreation & Parks Dept Maintenance Shed
- (k) Community plaza
- (l) Terraced seating

GATES & FENCING

- 11' tall art fence + 10' wide entry gate
- 8' tall park fence + RPD maintenance gates
- 8' louvered screening fence

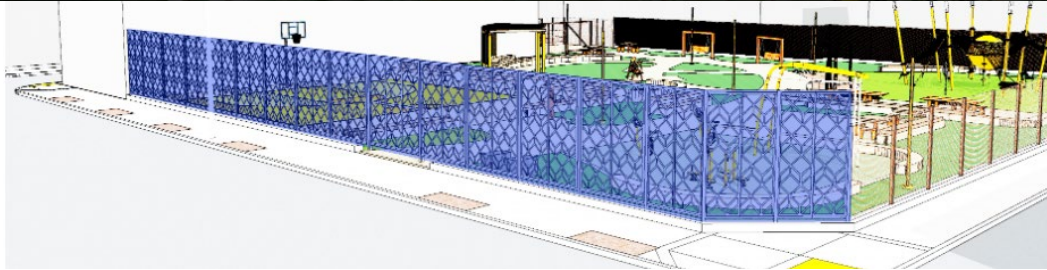

- SAN FRANCISCO RECREATION AND PARKS PLANS TO INSTALL A POWDER-COATED ALUMINUM PERIMETER FENCE AND ENTRY GATE ALONG 11TH STREET, WHICH PROVIDES AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE INTEGRATION OF A PERMANENT PUBLIC ARTWORK
- THE BUDGET FOR ARTWORK IS \$25,000, INCLUSIVE OF ALL ARTIST'S FEES, AS WELL AS ASSOCIATED EXPENSES FOR DESIGN AND CONSULTATION DURING FABRICATION AND INSTALLATION.
