



COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

BACKGROUND OF THE FUND

- Rincon Hill Area Plan approved in August 2005
- Expanded to include Central SOMA in 2018
- Leverages development impact fees to provide community stabilizing benefits in SOMA
- The Fund is administered by MOHCD

GEOGRAPHIC FOCUS







- Mission: to stabilize the community and promote equity through strategies that mitigate the impact of development.
- Vision: populations most vulnerable to displacement (individuals, families, businesses that serve and employ them, nonprofit organizations, community arts, and educational institutions) are able to live, work and prosper in a neighborhood that is safe and culturally and economically diverse.

BACKGROUND OF THE CAC

- A Community Advisory Committee was established to advise the City on expenditure of the Fund.
- Members are appointed by the BOS and advise MOHCD, other city agencies and BOS regarding administration of the SoMa Community Stabilization Fund
- The original members of the SOMA Stabilization Fund CAC were appointed in 2006

CAC PURPOSE + ROLES

- Prioritization of funding for social services related to cultural preservation, community improvement projects and other public investments
- Expenditure of affordable housing fees generated by projects in east SoMa, Central SoMa, Western SoMa Area Plans
- Collaborate with Planning and relevant city agencies in monitoring implementation of the Central SoMa Plan, Western SoMa Plan, and East SoMa Area Plan at approximately every 5th year
- Annual recommendations to MOHCD on the expenditure of SoMa Stabilization Fund

STRATEGIES

- Identify and address community gaps and needs around
 - housing/tenant protections
 - workforce and economic development
 - strength-based community services
- Build and strengthen community cohesion
- Strengthen capacity of existing community infrastructure to increase impact and effectiveness of services

PRIORITY AREAS

Since 2010, the City has invested over \$35MM through the SoMa Community Stabilization Fund for the following priorities:

- Economic development (e.g. job skills training, business accelerators)
- Tenant protections (e.g. tenant counseling, legal services)
- Capacity building (e.g. leadership dev, trauma-informed trainings)
- Capital Projects/Physical Infrastructure improvements
- Cultural preservation (e.g. arts and cultural events)
- Community cohesion (e.g. SOMA Community Collaborative)
- Strategic Planning
