- Impact Fee Deferral and Reduction Legislation (33% reduction in fees + 80% payment made at completion of construction)
- Major projects had not been moving forward
- Anticipated \$46M impact fee revenue at end of five years, \$165M at end of ten years

Expenditure

- Interagency Plan Implementation Committee (IPIC) maintained funding roster irrespective of reduction of fee revenue
- Roster included 16 projects of which 9 had budget appropriations
- Total roster value included \$114M, more than which we had projected revenue;
- No new projects added to infrastructure project roster
- No proposed new expenditures in the next two budget years

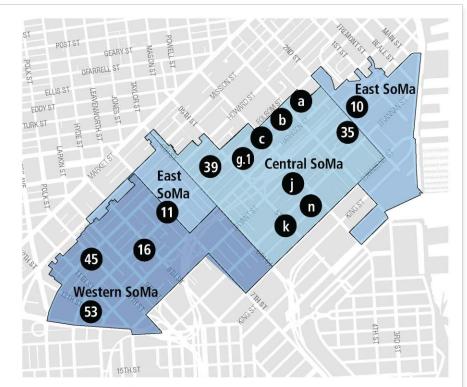

- CFD projections have not been updated

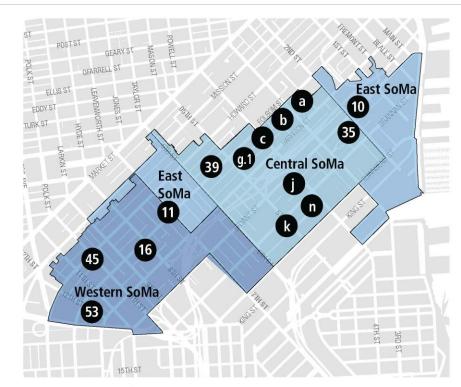

- Maintain roster of projects that have previous appropriations (i.e. have budget authorization)

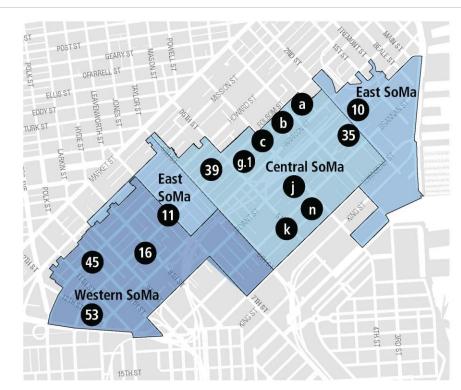

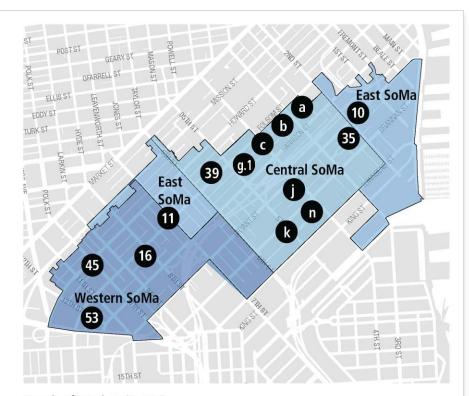

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Legislation Update

- Legislation introduced by Mayor Breed and Supervisor Dorsey on July 23, 2024 [Board File No. 240787]
- The proposed Ordinance would amend the Planning Code and Zoning Map to reduce commercial development requirements in the Central SoMa Special Use District and remove the Transit Center C-3-0(SD) Commercial Special Use District.
- Approved by the Planning Commission on October 24, 2024, will be heard at the Board of Supervisors early next year for their approval.
