COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS PRESENT TODAY:







The Fillmore / Western Addition is the heart of San Francisco's Black cultural life. For generations, it has been home to vibrant Black, Japanese, and Jewish communities — a rich blend reflected in its music, businesses, festivals, and landmarks. However, Urban Renewal and Redevelopment in the mid-20th century displaced Black residents, disrupting community ties and leaving lasting impacts that are still felt today.

The Fillmore Action Plan is a partnership between the City and community members to create lasting, community-driven change. Together we're focusing on four key areas: Housing, Health, Culture, and Workforce.

Through engagement, collaboration and consensus the plan will build a roadmap for meaningful short and long-term investments—one that honors the Fillmore's history and uplifts its future.

Rebuild trust and lasting partnerships between community members, City departments, and local institutions




Develop an Action Plan that serves as a framework for the neighborhood and guides future City and community investments.

### PROJECT DELIVERABLES

- Community Input Summary. Aggregate and summarize feedback from previous and current engagement processes to identify priorities.
- Current Projects and Programs Summary.

  Document and analyze existing City projects and programs funded this fiscal year.
- Existing Conditions Report. Document demographic, housing, health, cultural, and economic data.
- Topic Summaries. Create summaries of findings for Housing, Health, Placemaking and Culture, and Economic and Workforce Development
- Fundable Priorities Memo. Identify actionable priorities for near term.
- Action Plan. Synthesize findings into an Action Plan which outlines specific strategies and actions the City and community can take.
