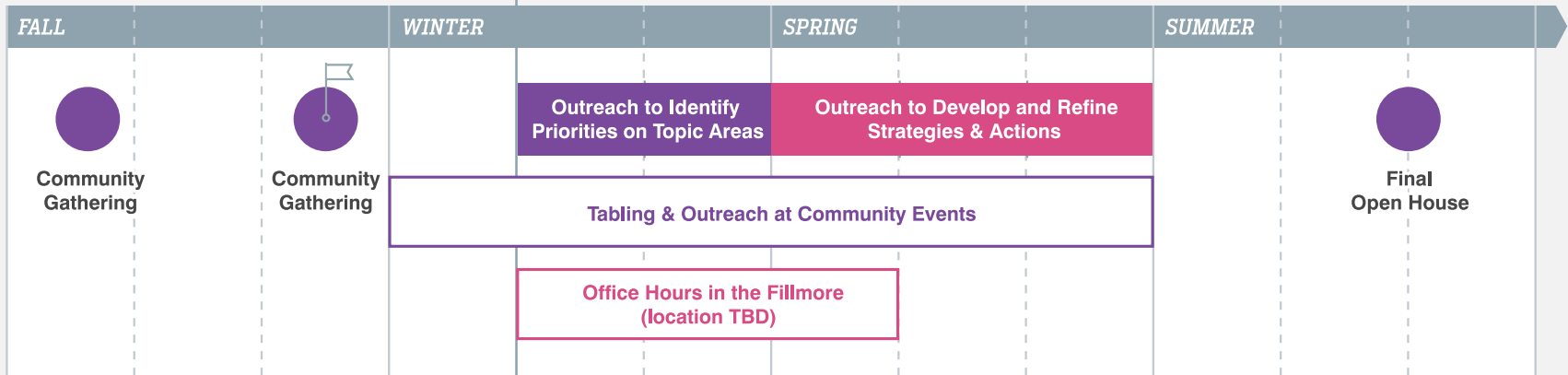

# STEERING COMMITTEE ROLES + SHAPE

# Establishing a Three-Pronged Approach



- **Community Action Plan Development**

- The City is committed to providing the steering committee with appropriate time to review and provide expertise on workshop content and materials.

- **Immediate Priority Actions**

- The City is committed to advancing priority actions. We seek feedback and consensus from the steering committee and the broader community on these actions.

- **Immediate Service Connections**

- The City is committed to including real-time access to City and CBO representatives who can connect residents to services and other support. We will seek input from the steering committee on city agencies and organizations to invite.

# Grounding the Plan in Existing Reports and Recommendations



- City staff are committed to building on past efforts and not start from scratch.
- Planning staff are reviewing existing City and community reports. We will share a list of these reports and confirm if any additional reports should be added.
- Planning staff are connecting with other city agencies to understand past outreach efforts and what community expertise has already been shared so this information can be included.
- Planning staff have collected information from city agencies about existing programs and projects to better understand what is currently happening and funded and will continue to share this as part of the planning process.

# Building Shared Leadership: Project Champions



- The **Champion** structure is designed to strengthen shared leadership, deepen subject-matter stewardship, and increase meaningful engagement within the Community Action Plan (CAP) process.
- This structure creates opportunities for Steering Committee members to Champion specific topic areas while working in close partnership with Planning and the Consultant.

Each Steering Committee member could have the opportunity to serve as a **Champion** for up to three (3) of the following areas:

- Health
- Housing
- Placemaking & Culture
- Economic & Workforce Development
- Healing

# Building Shared Leadership: Project Champions



## Champion Role:

- Serve as thought partners, facilitators, and ongoing stewards of specific topic areas throughout the planning process.
- Help direct workshop content & priorities.
- Meet with city staff/consultants to refine ideas and share out with broader steering committee.
- Option to co-facilitate small group discussions during workshop and/or co-facilitate during steering committee meetings.

## Why it is Important:

- Shares leadership and decision-making
- Strengthens accountability
- Deepens community voice
- Build partnership

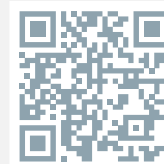
