MEETING #2 SUMMARY

Date: Tuesday, February 12, 2026

Time: 5:00pm-6:30pm

Location: 49 South Van Ness, Room 1544

Meeting Purpose

The purpose of this meeting is to meet the Healing and Cultural Heritage consultant, discuss the healing and cultural heritage framework that will potentially be incorporated in the planning process, and review draft content for the March 5th workshop.

Agenda

1. Welcome and Introductions (10 minutes)

The meeting began with welcome remarks and re-introductions of the nine Steering Committee members and participating City agency representatives in attendance.

2. Healing and Cultural Heritage Activity (25 minutes)

Hodari Davis from Edutainment for Equity introduced himself and shared his background and experience.

Mr. Davis went through a healing activity for the committee members to experience and provide feedback on. The healing activity included a series of images truth-telling about the Fillmore's history, including displacement, harmful policies, and community impacts. This meeting was an opportunity to test the healing activity and make refinements before a public workshop. Committee members had a number of comments about the activity. Members emphasized the importance of educating the next generation about what occurred, while also ensuring the content does not retraumatize the community. Committee members asked for the images to be refined to balance the difficult historical realities with uplifting images, positive history, and a forward-looking vision. Members stressed the need to "tell the whole story" - past, present, and

future - and to clearly connect historical harms to policies and systems that shaped current conditions. Mr. Davis asked committee members to provide additional images and resources that he could incorporate into the presentation.

3. Community Workshop Content Review (40 minutes)

Planning staff shared draft priorities and strategies for two topics - Housing and Health for steering committee members to provide their feedback on. Steering Committee members encouraged deeper engagement rather than broad, surface-level discussions, suggesting participants choose one topic per session. Recommendations included vetting strategies with community-based organizations, offering immediate resource support at the workshop, sharing how prior feedback has been incorporated into the draft priorities and strategies, and clearly outlining the path from input to action and implementation.

Concerns were raised about how to structure the workshop activity, so it fosters healing, captures table discussions effectively, and provides clear next steps for community engagement. Most noted that the public should define needs and priorities, while policy solutions should be developed by the City in response.

Planning staff shared a draft proposal for the workshop format which would include breaking into small groups with a facilitator and note-taker and having a discussion to gain community expertise. A public survey would also be shared following the meeting to get feedback from those that cannot attend.

4. Open Discussion (5 min)

City staff discussed interest in reaching consensus on priorities from the community before the close of budget season.

There was a discussion about the Superbowl and whether local Black-owned businesses were meaningfully included, reflecting broader concerns about equitable participation and economic opportunity.

5. Memorandum of Collaboration (5 min)

Planning staff shared a Memorandum of Collaboration for Steering Committee members to review and sign.
