
# New Public Spaces

Sponsors have learnt from the Phase I Parklet pilot and are reenvisioning the project. Core components of the Greenway Vision 2025 include a ground mural that reflects the Tenderloin's identity, string lights to brighten the block, expanded sidewalk greenery, and pilot food vending on the closed block with cafe tables and chairs. The long-term goal is to offer something for everyone, from toddlers to elders and everyone in between. New elements will begin rolling out in Fall 2025, with full implementation expected by the end of the year.

# 4. Elm Alley School Street


Transform Elm Alley by Tenderloin Community School into a School Street- an outdoor space for kids to play during after hours. The alley is currently closed M-F 8 am to 4 pm, when school is in session. The project hosted early morning activities for kids between 8am to 8:40 am until end of the 2023-2024 school year. And in school year 2024-2025 the project installed two murals, hosted activities at after school programs in the afternoon. Heading into the 2025-2026 school year, the team is focused on bringing more substantial infrastructure to the street including a gate to close the road, a roadway mural and additional staff to monitor the street. The team's priority is to organize the street elements for optimal safety and visibility and to broaden the participation of the local school and neighborhood communities.



# **6. Tenderloin National Forest Stabilization**

The project reopened regularly on July 1st, 2024. It is now providing consistent care with one part-time hired staff maintaining the grounds and coordinating programs offered and hosted at the site. This adds one more space to the open space network of the Tenderloin, providing much needed safe and green space for the neighborhood and its residents.

# 7. Myrtle Alley Activation

Starting in May 2025, the Tenderloin Museum, in collaboration with the creative team and performers of the Compton's Cafeteria Riot play, will steward Myrtle Alley by organizing five monthly activations through September 2025. These events aim to generate positive foot traffic by featuring live performances, such as music, drag shows, and DJ sets, while also providing a platform for neighboring art galleries.

Continued the Safe Passage Ambassadors Program and maintained the expanded escorts for special events to support children, seniors, and people with disabilities till June 2024.












# Park Activities and Celebrations


# 10. Tenderloin People's Holiday **Tree and Lighting Ceremony**

## **12.** Grace Notes Community Festival 2023






#### 14. Clean Team

Clean Team stewards are people hired to clean and take care of streets for a safer neighborhood. TLCBD's Clean Team maintained their extended support to the City's street response operations to improve street conditions, and the health and wellbeing of residents and their streets by removing trash and other hazards from the streets. The Clean Team also provide service support for community events and cultural celebrations. TCAP funded contract was through June 2024.



## 17. Capacity Building for Tenderloin **Southeast Asian Community**

The Southeast Asian Community Center (SEACC) served the Southeast Asian community through translation services, education, physical activities, health, and social services. SEACC provided business technical assistance and support Southeast Asian business owners in the Tenderloin to apply for city grants. The Center helped increase independent living and opportunities for social experiences, clean, safe, and accessible to everyone.




DISH completed its service in December 2023, delivered 23,000 meals prepared by La Cocina entrepreneurs to supportivehousing residents recovering from long-term homelessness to improve their access to quality and healthy food, and quality of life. Over 80 percent of residents indicated that they feel a sense of dignity and respect receiving La Cocina meals.



# **18.** Tenderloin Night Navigators Program

Through providing resources, referrals, de-escalation support, and other on-thespot, as well as medium-term case management services led by Code Tenderloin in partnership DPH and San Francisco Community Health Center (SFCHC), the Program adds capacity to community public health care. The team operates every night from 7 p.m. to 3 a.m., engaging with the community and providing essential support. Since its launch in October 2023, the program has conducted over 10,000 engagements, with approximately 1,400 individuals (14%) receiving needs assessments and care plans, and successfully being connected to vital resources. The program is now permanently funded by DPH.













### 16. Community Housing Education for Tenderloin Arabic-speaking Residents

Four in-language workshops to help expand affordable housing information and education program for Arabic residents on how to apply online, prepare for the lease-up process, and learn about tenants' rights with accessible language and cultural sensitivity.



The Salvation Army Kroc Center hired staff to deliver a safe and clean space for Tenderloin teens to spend time on Mondays – Fridays from 4:00–8:00 PM. The center provides low-barrier access to facilities such as a fitness gym, basketball gym, game room, and more. The Center will be a one-year program with the intention to expand in partnership with other organizations to offer training workshops, field trips to college campuses, and other summer field trips to amusement parks, sports games, and cultural events. To shape programming that reflects community needs, the Kroc Center will engage teens and parents to help plan events and workshops. Incentives will be offered to encourage participation from disconnected youth.



## 19. Tenderloin Family Housing **Tutoring Program**

The Tenderloin Family Housing Tutoring Program addresses Math or English school and educational needs of low-income student residents at 201 Turk with potential additional slots for youths in the Tenderloin. The Program offered students a free tutoring program during both the school year and summer break. Tutoring is offered in-person twice per week and one-on-one in Chinese, Arabic, Spanish, and English through spring 2025.



### **21.** Tenderloin Arab Youth and **Mental Health Center**

The Center provided mental health support to Arab youth and their families in addition to culturally competent activities and programming to keep youth engaged outside of school, build bonds with peers, and develop life skills in a safe, supervised environment. The Center opened on 49 Grove Street in November 2023 and provided one-on-one sessions to more than 30 Arab youth and served over 140 additional family members to improve their mental health through September 2024. Because of the program's strong impact, it has attracted new private funding to sustain and expand its work. The Center will now also serve adults and offer additional resources, including navigation support for newly arrived English learners and tutoring services to meet broader community needs.
